



About Bud Wymore

Kent “Bud” Wymore, IV, is a husband, father, attorney, and Hays County civic leader. As past Chairman and current General Counsel for the Hays County Republican Party, Bud’s reputation for hard work and getting results has earned the confidence of local party and community leaders. Bud is running for State Representative to give his community an effective advocate and proven problem-solver in the Texas House. While still attending law school, Bud was elected one of the youngest chairs to ever lead the Hays County Republican Party, taking the helm of the county party amidst a time of internal division and financial strife. Through his diligent efforts in office, Bud restored confidence in the local party organization, dramatically improved party fundraising, and unified Hays County Republicans behind the primary goal of winning at the ballot box in November with a slate of highly qualified and broadly respected county-level candidates.

After concluding his tenure as party chair, Bud continues to serve as the party’s General Counsel. Recently, Bud successfully defended a critical Republican victory in the 2018 general election against a Democratic legal challenge that threatened the narrow Republican majority on the county commissioner’s court. He also served as Parliamentarian for county and senate district Republican conventions, and was appointed by the Hays County Commissioner’s Court to serve on the county’s redistricting committee, where he worked to ensure fair representation throughout the community.

With his wife, Amy, the Wymores reside in Driftwood with their four children, Kent, Isla, Abigail, and Avery, who attend Hays CISD schools. Bud and Amy play active roles in their children’s education, and Bud served two terms on the Campus Leadership Team at his children’s elementary school. For the past six years, Bud has volunteered as a youth sports coach through Neighborhood Sports. The Wymores are members of Driftwood United Methodist Church.
